# SCHOLARSHIP DESCRIPTIONS

## Barry Goldwater Scholarship

The Barry Goldwater Scholarship Program, one of the oldest and most prestigious national scholarships in the natural sciences, engineering and mathematics in the United States, seeks to identify and support college sophomores and juniors who show exceptional promise of becoming the nation's next generation of research leaders in these fields. Barry Goldwater Scholarships are awarded to outstanding juniors and sophomores who intend to pursue research careers in mathematics, the natural sciences, or engineering.

## Dougherty Scholarship

The Dougherty Scholarship serves to honor undergraduate students who demonstrate the dedication to the Chapman community embodied by former Vice President of Enrollment and Student Life, Cindy Dougherty. Two scholarships are awarded to two undergraduate students each academic year.

## Jerry Price Campus Leadership Award

This award, endowed by Brad and Kim Cohen, recognizes a student who is a change maker through their leadership. The recipient is a student who has overcome adversity or has recognized the need for change within the University or surrounding communities, and has shown leadership and initiative to realize that change. Students are not nominated for the Jerry Price Campus Leadership Award; they are instead invited to apply. Undergraduate students who have a 3.0 GPA or higher, are involved in a Chapman student organization, are Chapman Grant eligible, and plan to be enrolled in Fall 2023 are eligible.

## Phi Beta Kappa

Phi Beta Kappa is the oldest academic honor society in the United States and is regarded as the most prestigious honor society, with fewer than 10% of colleges having Phi Beta Kappa chapters. To be a Phi Beta Kappa member, a student must have a top GPA and meet selective national requirements in mathematics, foreign languages, character, and breadth and depth in the liberal arts and sciences. These students are counted as the top 10% of the University's undergraduate liberal arts and science students and are granted lifetime membership.

# AWARD DESCRIPTIONS

## Outstanding Leaders in Each Class

The Chapman Outstanding Leadership Awards are given to the outstanding leaders in each class, (first year, sophomore, junior, senior) for their leadership and dedicated service to the quality of life and campus community programs at Chapman University. Excellent and distinguished leadership in at least one facet of university life and a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 are required.

## James L. Doti Outstanding Graduate Student Award

The Chapman Outstanding Graduate Student Award is given for outstanding leadership and dedicated service to the quality of life and campus community programs of Chapman University. Students are not nominated for the Outstanding Graduate Student Award; they are selected by the faculty based on their outstanding academic record.

## Outstanding Diversity Leadership Award

This award is presented to the graduating senior who has shown exemplary promotion of social justice, multicultural, and diversity and inclusion initiatives at Chapman. This award is based upon the student's accomplishments and efforts over the course of their college career. Nominees must be full-time and senior students at the university with a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Nominees' work should reflect a strong commitment to diversity, as well as demonstrate significant contributions to inclusive community building and evidence of positive impact on the entire University community.

## Paul S. Delp Outstanding Service Award

This award is presented to the graduating senior judged to have made the greatest contribution of public service to the community at large. This award is based upon the student's entire record of service, addressing any number of economic, environmental, or social issues, during their college career. A minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5 is required. Nominees must be full-time and senior students at Chapman and demonstrate substantial commitment to a life of service as evidenced by documented activities that significantly benefit the greater good and serve as models to others.

# AWARD DESCRIPTIONS

## **Ronald M. Huntington Outstanding Scholarship Award**

This award is presented to the graduating senior judged to have exhibited the most distinguished record of scholarly accomplishments while a student at Chapman University. Evidence of exemplary scholarship well beyond normal classroom activities is expected and a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5 is required. Nominees must be full-time students and seniors at Chapman and demonstrate evidence of meritorious scholarship.

## **Gloria and Julian Peterson Outstanding Leadership Award**

This award is presented to the graduating senior who has given distinguished leadership in their dedication to enriching university life. This student must exemplify leadership as represented in at least three of the four pillars that guide Chapman University: Intellectual, Physical, Social, and Spiritual. A minimum cumulative GPA of 3.0 is required. This is Chapman's highest senior leadership award.

## **Cecil F. Cheverton Award**

The Cheverton Award is the oldest and highest undergraduate student honor, awarded by a vote of the full Chapman faculty. A gift of the class of 1929, the original bronze Cheverton Award cup remains on exhibit in Argyros Forum along with its successor, a silver bowl. These trophies are engraved with the names of all Cheverton awardees since 1929.
